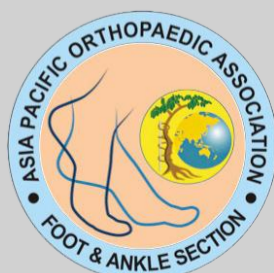

## LOCAL CUISINE

Thai food is one-of-a-kind and a must to try when in Bangkok. From tom yum to green curry to mango sticky rice, they are mouth-watering and for a very good reason. Local Thai cuisine can be found anywhere such as in Chinatown and Victory Monument.

## SHOPPING

## WAT PHO

Wat Pho (the Temple of the Reclining Buddha), or Wat Phra Chetuphon, is located behind the Temple of the Emerald Buddha and a must-do for any first-time visitor in Bangkok. It's one of the largest temple complexes in the city and famed for its giant reclining Buddha that measures 46 metres long and is covered in gold leaf.

108 is a significant number, referring to the 108 positive actions and symbols that helped lead Buddha to perfection. You'll need to take your shoes off to enter, and if you would like a little good luck, we recommend purchasing a bowl of coins at the entrance of the hall which you can drop in the 108 bronze bowls which line the length of the walls.

## GRAND PALACE

The palace at one time was the king's home as well as the place where the government of Thailand carried out their work. Nowadays, the Grand Palace is used for ceremonies, and it is mostly seen as a tourist attraction. There is a strict dress code enforced at the Grand Palace, and you will not be allowed inside if you are not dressed appropriately. Also, be aware of potential scams when outside the palace and only pay the entrance fee when you are actually going in!

Take a bus from Don Mueang Airport to Kan Bin Thai. From here, walk for 2 km to BTS Skytrain Mo Chit Station. Take the train to Nana Station and walk 200 m to Hyatt Regency.	1 hour 19 minutes	Approximately THB 70
Airport Taxi / Grab (Car Hailing App)	15 minutes (non-peak hour)	Approximately THB 300 – 350 per journey. There might be one or two highway tolls on the way to the hotel.
